

MAYOR'S MONTHLY MESSAGE-June 2026

Dear Neighbors,

The Board of Trustees has accepted bids for the replacement of the Tuxedo Lake water main, which is nearly 100 years old and is vital to supplying water to all homes on the west side of Tuxedo Lake, as well as for replacement of old asbestos piping on Mountain Road, which serves Town customers of the Village water system.

The Code Revision Committee headed by Professor of Law Barry Hawk, has submitted its report with recommendations for changes in the Village Code. The Committee's report and recommendations will be reviewed by the Board of Trustees over the next several months in public discussion.

The new South Gate communications system between the police booth and the Gate, which allows our police officers to speak directly with non-resident drivers, is expected to be installed and operational on July 1.

The Village has created a liaison with the developers of Tuxedo Reserve and the Town of Tuxedo to protect the interests of the Village as the massive project comes to fruition.

The Board of Trustees will continue to discuss the proposed law to prohibit unattended dogs from roaming throughout the Village at the next meeting on July 16.

Tuxedo Lake is scheduled to receive algae treatment from The Pond & Lake Connection Corp. on Monday, July 6.

The DPW is busy "weed whacking" the Village trails, so that residents may enjoy hiking in the woods.

Due to the retirement of a regular member, the Board of Architecture review is once again seeking an alternate member. The alternate member will fully participate in all discussions and vote on applications when less than 5 regular members are present. Please contact me for more information.
